I loved every minute and every place. Most moving conference in a long time.

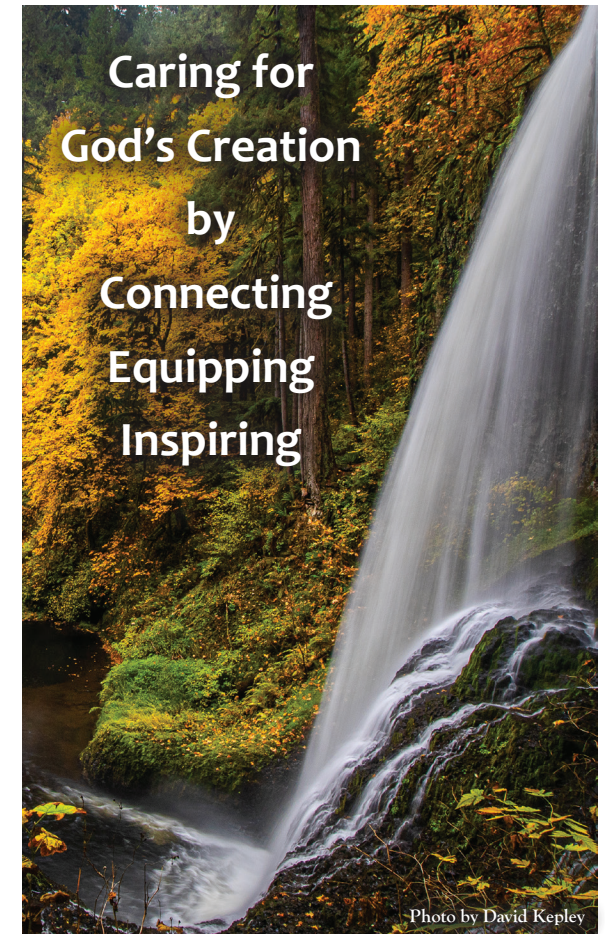

Reaching Out to All Presbyterians

Presbyterians for Earth Care (PEC) is a national eco-justice network that cares for God's creation by connecting, equipping, and inspiring PC(USA) Presbyterians to make creation care a central concern of the church.

Founded in 1995 to help the denomination educate and energize church members to address environmental concerns, it works in partnership with PC(USA)'s **Presbyterian Hunger Program** and the **Office of Public Witness** to promote eco-justice with a biblical and theological base.

PEC is governed by a volunteer Steering Committee including six Regional Representatives. A paid part-time coordinator serves the committee and the membership. Active volunteer committees are essential to PEC's work, and members are welcome to participate in the Program, Advocacy, Communications, and Organizational Development Committees.

Inspiring through conferences, earth care stories of congregations and individuals, and sharing theological perspectives on eco-justice issues.

How We Network

- Provide opportunities for members to interact at national and regional conferences on timely eco-justice issues.
- Partner with PC(USA) **Sustainable Living & Earth Care Concerns** to promote Earth Care Congregations.
- Help young adults explore their faith and environmental advocacy through **Creation Action Network of**

Presbyterian Young Adults (CANOPY).

Prepare and promote earth care overtures through presbyteries for consideration at General Assembly.

Provide models of earth care ministry by honoring individuals, congregations, and institutions with annual awards.

Offer opportunities to share earth care thoughts and accomplishments through social media.

Connect members to fresh ideas with news, success stories, and reflections through a quarterly e-newsletter (EARTH) and Advent and Lenten devotionals.
